Hygiene - Parasites	Staff and children		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • After handling the dogs make sure the children and staff all wash their hands. • Hand sanitiser should not be used a substitute for handwashing with soap and water. • Establish routines and procedures to teach the children about good hygiene habits around animals such as washing hands and avoiding the dog's mouth area. Scratches	Staff, pupils and handlers	Low	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The dog will be always supervised when in contact with children and staff. Handler to be sensitive and vigilant to the children's and dog's responses around each other. One adult with the dog and at least one adult with the children if there are more than 2 children. • Children taught how to behave and to approach dog safely. • Children to only pat the dog when he is stood or sat still. • Children to be taught the rules of safe animal interaction, rules to be re-enforced by all staff. • The dog's claws will be kept trimmed. • The dog is trained to not jump up and to remain calm. • Appointed members of staff involved are experienced dog owners and handlers. • Dog will be kept on the lead whilst walking around the school grounds. Dog bite	Staff and children	Low	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Suitable public liability insurance policy is in place for the dog which would be used in the event of a claim. • Handlers are trained in working with children and are familiar with the dog. • Children are taught how to approach the dog safely. • Children to be taught the rules of safe animal interaction, rules to be re-enforced by all staff. • Dog's temperament has been externally assessed. • Staff to always supervise the dog and keep it on a lead when moving around the school. • Only small groups of children to be with the dog at any one time. Children taught where to appropriately pat the dog. • Handler or member of staff to say 'no' firmly, if mouth contact looks likely or if a change in mood is detected in the dog. Allergy or Asthmatic reaction	Staff and children	Low	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Parental consent form issued for pupils who have close, regular contact with the dog. • All parents will be notified about the school dog and given the opportunity to advise of their child's allergies. Medical records used to check pupils identified as having an allergy and not to have contact with dog. • Dog bedding regularly washed. • Good hygiene routines and hand washing to be followed by all who meet the dog. • Days when dog is in school to be circulated. Phobias	Staff and pupils	Low	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Parental consent form to be issued for pupils to have close contact with dog. • Dog is gentle, well trained and registered as a therapy dog, therefore externally assessed as being suitable to be around children. • Visitors advised and dog removed if necessary to a suitable alternative room. If an issue is pre-determined dog will not come into school that day. • Where there is an identified phobia/anxiety the dog is not banned from coming to school, but every effort is made to segregate the dog from the people with phobias/ anxiety. Activities and games involving the dog	Staff, pupils, dogs and handlers		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Handler(s) remain with dogs at all times • Handler(s) speak to school staff in advance and make sure the area and activity is safe • We check with the handler(s) and set a limit for the number of children who can interact with a dog at once • Handler(s) clean up urine and faeces • School staff remove children who misbehave or upset dogs • We set a time limit on activities as recommended by handlers, so dogs do not get tired 	Y	Anne Gibbard / handler Sue King
Children misbehaving	Pupils, dogs and handlers		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Children are told in advance what to expect and how to behave – clear expectations • Dog owner/PAT volunteer must have control of the dog at all times and dog is kept on lead • School staff are present at all time during the visit • School staff are ready to remove children who misbehave or upset dogs 	Y	Anne Gibbard / Support Staff accompanying child to reading session / dog handler Sue King

Animal Welfare	The dog, staff and children		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The dog has time away from the children undisturbed. • The dog only works with the children in short bursts. • The dog is not in school full-time. • The dog does not come to school in very hot weather. • The dog's welfare is monitored by the owner and staff.
